The course on the Psychology of Justice examines legal concepts such as the concepts of crime and criminality, institutions of criminal law, the penal system, the judicial process, factors influencing judges' decision-making, the institution of testimony, and the state of victimization, based on contemporary data from the psychology of justice, which has become a separate scientific discipline today. It interprets subconscious states that influence crime and substance-related criminal behavior across disciplines.
