## Course Content:

This course covers the provision of public health services, the right to health and the right to life, the fundamental principles of medical ethics, medical law and basic concepts, the development of patient rights and international patient rights declarations, the conditions for the legality of medical intervention, and the nature of the legal relationship between the patient, physician, and healthcare provider. The legal liability of physicians, criminal liability, and administrative liability; fundamental patient rights; the legal dimension of informed consent; informed consent in special medical interventions; sexual and reproductive health rights; tissue and organ transplantation; medical research; protection of personal health data; and health tourism.
