2	The Subject of Social Psychology	1 of the book Social Psychology is read.	Brainstorming Small group discussion: "What would we not understand without social psychology?"		
3		Relevant section from the book is read. A brief chronological timeline is prepared (individually).	Presentation and sharing of ideas.		
4	Basic concepts of social psychology	Compile a list of concepts (self, social influence, norm, attitude, etc.). Writing an example for each concept from one's own life.	Concept matching game. Mini case analysis.		
5	Methods and examples in social psychology research	Reading + Conduct a brief research on one of the Milgram, Asch, or Zimbardo experiments.	Short video presentation (experiment examples). Experiment design group activity: "What would you investigate if you were in charge?" Discussion: "Where do ethical boundaries begin?"		
6		Definitions of fundamental theories are read (behaviourism, cognitive, evolutionary, etc.). Each student selects a theory and explains it using an example from daily life.	Group work: "The strengths and weaknesses of theories." Debate activity (based on two different theories).		



7	Approach, attraction, love, and romance	Reading is done + brief notes are taken on factors influencing attraction in romantic relationships. Thinking question: "What are the cultural factors that determine attraction?"	Case study (relationship dynamics). Small group discussions. Role-playing: first meeting scenarios.

10	Our relationships, self and identity	The section containing definitions of self and identity is read. Short self-assessment: "How does the concept of self affect my relationships?"	Self-awareness exercise (drawing a self-map). Presentation + case studies.		
11	Perception, Attitudes and Prejudice	The section explaining the attitude—behaviour relationship is read. An example of prejudice from daily life is provided (written or verbal).	Presentation panel, Discussion: "How do prejudices form?" Role-play: prejudiced situations and alternative responses.		
12	Social Impact and Conformity Behaviour	A short reading and video viewing about the Asch experiment. A short essay on the question, "Have you ever felt social pressure?"	Reenactment of the Asch experiment in class. Group discussion: "Why do we conform?" Interpretation of the experiment results.		
13	Social Groups	The section on group dynamics is read. Short observational essay on the characteristics of a group they belong to.	Small group activity: determining group norms. Group role analysis activity. Case study: group conflicts.		
14	Human Relations and Emotional Intelligence	The concept of emotional intelligence is read. A short EI (emotional intelligence) self-assessment form is completed.	Role-play: situations involving empathy. Group discussion: "The role of emotional intelligence in relationships." Presentation + case studies.
