Cour Cont		This course introduces the concept of volunteering and volunteer management to encourage students' active participation in volunteer activities. It covers the definition and scope of volunteering, the roles and responsibilities of volunteers, and the principles of volunteer management and organization. Core areas of volunteering—such as disaster and emergency response, environment, education, culture and tourism, sports, health, and social services—are examined. Throughout the semester, students develop a project in a selected field of volunteering, form project teams, prepare plans, and engage in field applications. By gaining experience in voluntary work with non-governmental organizations (NGOs), they strengthen their sense of social responsibility and solidarity. At the end of the term, students submit a written report and present the results of their volunteer projects.
