## Topic: Comparing Two Developmental Stages

Your task is to select and compare two children at different developmental stages (e.g., a toddler and a pre-schooler). You should write a report analyzing and comparing their daily routines, food needs, and required safety rules. Your writing should be about 90 words.

## Language Requirements & Focus

Use the following grammar structures and vocabulary:

- ♣ Present Simple Tense (for routines), am/is/are, Possessive Adjectives (his/her), Adjectives, and Hours/Time.
- ♣ Words related to Daily Routines, Food & Drinks, and Developmental Activities (play, run, draw).
- **♣** Comparison (e.g., *smaller than, sleeps more than*), and Modal Verbs (can, cannot for rules and ability).

## Project Structure and Steps

Organize your report into three parts:

## **Part1: Child Profiles**

Introduce the two children you will compare.

- **↓** Child A (Toddler, 2–3 Years Old): State his/her name and age. Use am/is/are and adjectives to describe his/her personality.
  - Example: His name is Leo. He is two years old. He is very active and curious.
- **♣ Child B** (Pre-schooler, 5–6 Years Old): State his/her name and age. Use am/is/are and adjectives to describe his/her personality.
  - Example: Her name is Mia. She is five years old. She is helpful and talkative.

#### Part 2: Daily Routines and Needs

Compare their daily life and needs using the Present Simple Tense.

- **♣ Sleep & Wake-up:** Compare their sleep habits. Use Comparison. *Example: Leo sleeps ten hours, but Mia sleeps eight hours.*
- **Activities & Ability:** Compare their typical daily activities. What can each child do? What do they play?
  - Example: Leo plays with blocks, but Mia can draw pictures and write her name.
- **♣ Food & Meals**: Compare their food requirements. What do they like/dislike? *Example: Leo eats soft food. Mia eats vegetables, but she does not like milk.*

#### **Part 3: Safety and Rules**

Discuss the different rules and safety requirements for each child.

- **▼ Toddler (Child A) Rules:** State 2–3 safety rules for the younger child. *Example: Leo must not touch the hot oven. His toys must be big.*
- **♣ Pre-schooler (Child B) Rules**: State 2–3 rules for the older child, often related to behavior or school.
  - Example: Mia must clean her room. She must not run in the classroom.
- ♣ Briefly state the first and most important difference between the two developmental stages. Example: The first big difference is independence. Mia can dress herself, but Leo needs his mother's help.
