Understanding Prose

- Prose is a form of language with natural flow and
- grammatical structure, unlike poetry's rhythmic structure.
- Examples include novels, short stories, and essays. Prose
- is straightforward, focusing on ideas and information.
- Characteristics of prose include clear sentences,
- paragraphs, and a logical progression of ideas.





Characteristics of Prose

- Written in paragraphs (not verse)
- No rhythmic or metrical structure
- Focus on narrative, description, and exposition





Types of Prose

1.Fictional Prose (Literary Prose) Novel (Definition, history, types: realism, modernism, etc.) Short story (Differences from the novel, famous examples) 2. Non-Fictional Prose Essay (Definition, structure, and types: argumentative, narrative, descriptive, etc.) **Biography & Autobiography** Memoirs & Diaries **Articles & Reports 3.Dramatic Prose (Plays written in prose form)**



Literary Elements in Prose

- Plot (Exposition, Rising Action, Climax, Falling Action, Resolution)
- Characterization (Types of characters: protagonist, antagonist, flat,
- round, dynamic, static)
- Point of View (First-person, third-person limited, omniscient, etc.)
- Theme (Main ideas explored in prose works)
- Style & Tone (How the writer conveys meaning)

Understanding Poetry

Poetry is a literary form that uses aesthetic and rhythmic qualities of language to evoke meanings. It often involves meter, rhyme, and stanzas. Types of poetry include sonnets, haikus, and free verse. Characteristics include expressive language, imagery, and emotional resonance.









Characteristics of Poetry

- Use of rhythm, meter, and rhyme
- Condensed, symbolic, and figurative language
- Often written in stanzas and verses





- Narrative Poetry (Tells a story)
- Lyric Poetry (Expresses emotions and feelings)
- Dramatic Poetry
- Free Verse & Experimental Poetry

Key Differences Between Prose and Poetry

- Structure: Paragraphs vs. Stanzas
- Language: Direct vs. Figurative
- Rhythm & Meter: Absent in prose, present in poetry
- Flexibility: Prose is more flexible, poetry follows patterns
